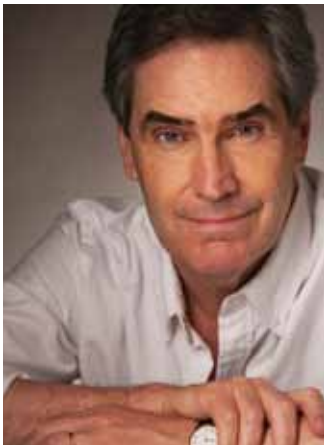

HISTORY

The Liberal Party of Canada is the only federal political party that has operated continuously since Confederation. The Party's roots trace back to the early democratic reformers, including William Lyon Mackenzie, Louis-Joseph Papineau, Joseph Howe, Robert Baldwin and George Brown. There have been nine Liberal Prime Ministers of Canada. Their governments have been responsible for shaping the very fabric of Canada's public institutions.

1984 – Canada Health Act

1995 – Firearms Act

1997 – Canada Child Tax Benefit

1998 – Eliminated the deficit and balanced the budget

2000 – Clarity Act

2002 – Ratified the Kyoto Protocol

Coffee served on site is made from shade-grown, fair trade, and organically grown coffee beans.

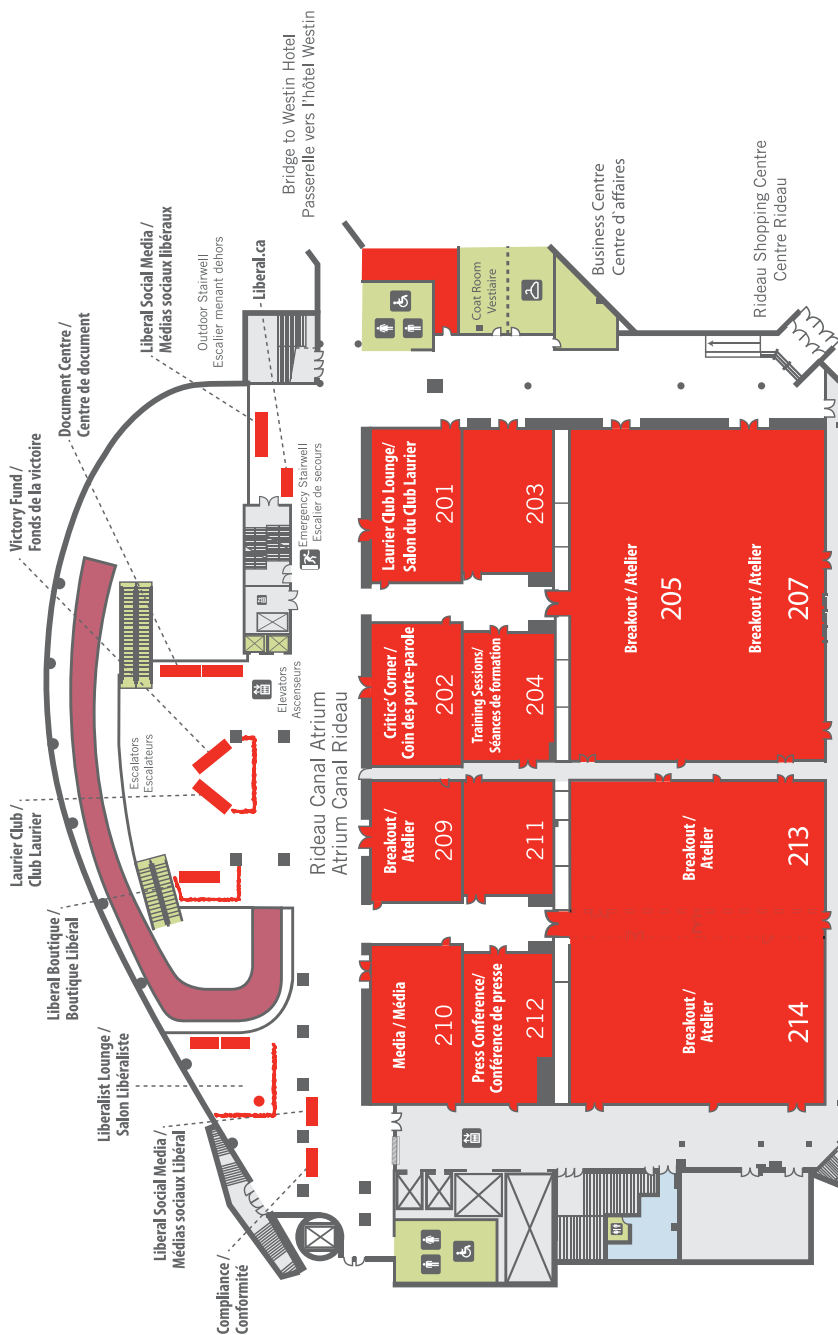

Ottawa Convention Centre: Floor Plans

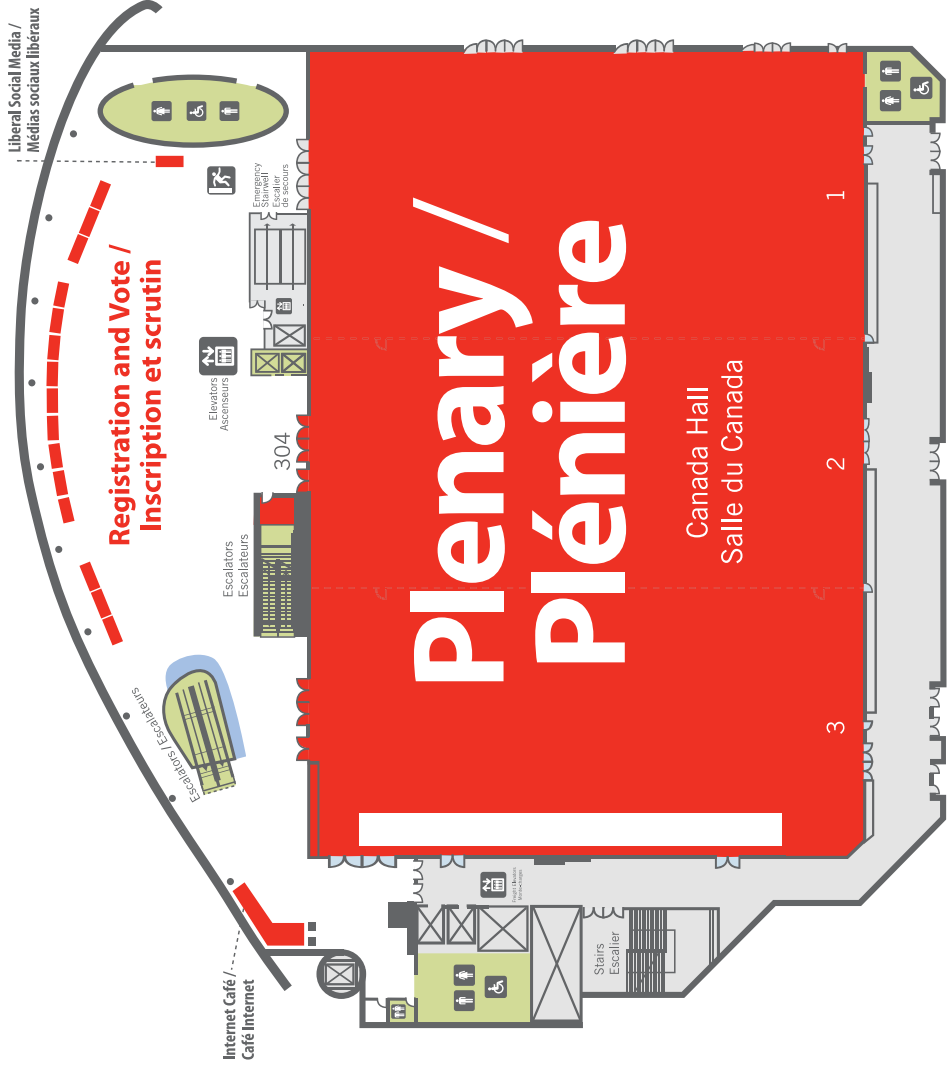


Level 2 Ottawa Convention Centre: Floor Plans
